	people populating the State of Haryana, State of
	Uttarakhand, State of Bihar, State of Uttar Pradesh, State of
	Madhya Pradesh, State of Chhattisgarh, State of West
	Bengal, State of Jharkhand and NCT, Delhi, besides it being
	of great religious and cultural value to the large sections of
	our society. Therefore, in continuation of our order dated
	20th October, 2014 passed in the case, we further direct that
	the special Committee constituted by the Tribunal and the
	State Pollution Control Boards of all these States shall take
	immediate steps to ensure that no industry which has not
	obtained or is operating without the consent of the Board

and is a polluting industry is permitted any longer to discharge their effluents directly or indirectly into the river Ganga or any of its tributaries. The Boards shall also take steps for closure of such units in accordance with law. It will also inform industries of this order. They shall file the Status Report before the Tribunal on the next date of hearing.

In the meanwhile, we also direct that the meeting of Secretary, MoEF, Secretary, Ministry of Water Resources, Chief Secretaries of all the above States will be held on 11th November, 2014 at 01:00 PM in our chamber. On this meeting the list of polluting industries of river Ganga and its tributaries under classification formulated by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its order and/or by the CPCB shall be provided by the respective states. Secondly, every State shall place before the Tribunal their policy formulated for prevention and control of pollution of river Ganga and its tributaries as well as restoration of her wholesome water.

The MoEF will communicate the order to all the concerned authorities. The above meeting is necessitated for the reason that an individual Secretary of the State Governments may not be able to effectively participate in the requisite decision making as it will also involve multi departmental decision of the concerned states which will have inter-state impact. It is necessary that the highest executive authorities of the concerned states, participate in this meeting to provide for co-ordinated effective resolution of the environmental issues involved in the present case in regard to River Ganga and its Tributaries.

In view of the aforesaid developments, the date already given as 4th December, 2014 in the present case shall stand preponed to 17th November, 2014. As all the Learned
