Notice for Industries

Through this notice it is informed that all the industrial units which discharge effluent, requiring 'Consent to Operate' from Haryana State Pollution Control under the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, are mandated to meet the standards prescribed for discharge of effluent under Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986. Hon'ble Supreme Court vide its order dated 22.02.2017 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 375 of 2012 titled 'Paryavaran Suraksha Samiti and Another Vs Union of India and Others' has directed that all such units will make their primary effluent treatment plants fully operational to the required capacity to meet the prescribed standards before 21.05.2017. The Haryana State Pollution Control Board will conduct inspections thereafter to verify whether such functional primarily effluent treatment plants have been installed as per the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court and will restrain such units from any further industrial activiy, if they are found to be non-complying.
